- II. Rewrite these sentences, changing the subjects to plural if they are singular and to singular if they are plural. Make other changes as necessary. You will have to change the verb ending. If there is an adjective or complement you might have to change its ending as well.
- III. Change the following sentences to say the opposite, according to the examples given, i.e. subjects become direct objects and direct objects become subjects. Then identify the gender of each noun by writing **M** above all masculine nouns and **F** above all feminine nouns.
- IV. Choose the correct verb to complete each sentence, and then translate the sentences. There are three choices of the same verb. Select the choice that fits grammatically. Don't forget to translate.
- V. In the story below, label all subjects with the letter **S**, all direct objects with the letters **DO**, all complements with the letter **C**, all transitive verbs with the letters **TV**, all intransitive verbs with the letters **IV**, all linking verbs with the letters **LV**, and all complementary infinitives with the letters **CI**. The story is in Latin.
- VI. Based on the story above, answer the following questions using complete Latin sentences. The questions are in Latin. Be sure to review the meanings of *quid*, *cur*, and *ubi*.
- VII. Translate these sentences into Latin. There are three long sentences. Nearly every word can be found in the test.
